His teaching style requires students to be fully engaged during lecture, you couldn't just copy the slides and understand the material. He was also respectful and understanding when answering students question but did not go off on tangents if it wasn't relevant to the course.

Prof. Jeram often rambles on example and tangents, struggled to know what is important vs what he just finds interesting to talk about, the schedule changed like crazy so was hard to follow.
The way you explained the "direct democracies" of the ancient mediteranean was more confusing than it was helpful. The Deme structure in athens was a somewhat representative body, and could make decisions without a plebisite. And I don't know what kind of "direct democracy" ever existed in Rome, or when there was any "logic of equality" in Roman society. I understand that this isn't a history class, and that your examples served to make a point about the difficulties involved in developing democracies, but I don't think it had the desired effect. It made it seem like democracies are inherently more advanced than non-democratic systems, and made the transition to a modern liberal democracy seem like a continuous, inevitable transformation. Liked the rest of the course though
