





Continuing with this topic, I felt that this course was a little bit too difficult for those who are not pursuing a path towards political science. I felt that some of the material that was involved in lecture required that we had some previous knowledge when we did not. Some topics were difficult to understand and I wished that it was better explained.

I also want to talk about Tophat. I felt that the interactive aspect of it was a very good part to our lectures. Until it didn't work, I felt we could have done something else. We could have used iclickers for multiple choice questions that you propose. Unless this is our first semester and only course we are taking, I'm sure a lot of us have existing iclickers or could have went and got one. Because Sanjay is very knowledgable he often talks about events or terms that are difficult to understand or grasp for someone who does not know much about politics. The much of the material learned is all new and so this course was hard to understand and follow much of the time. Also as for tutorials, I found that there were a lot of differences between the different tutorial instructors. and they taught tutorial. A better constructed tutorial would be more helpful in understanding the course material and knowing what exactly what is needed in order to receive a good mark in the tutorial.
