

About the Instructor's Report

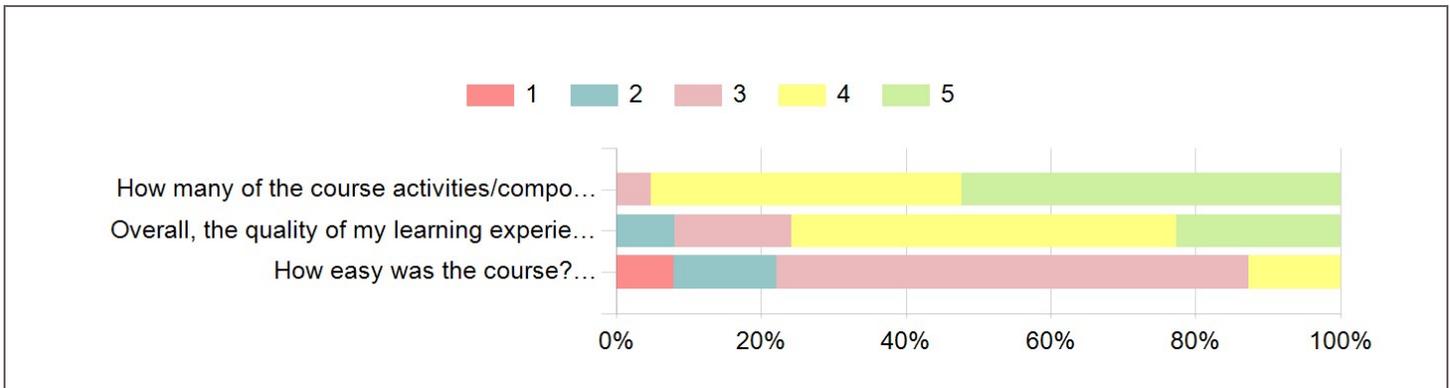

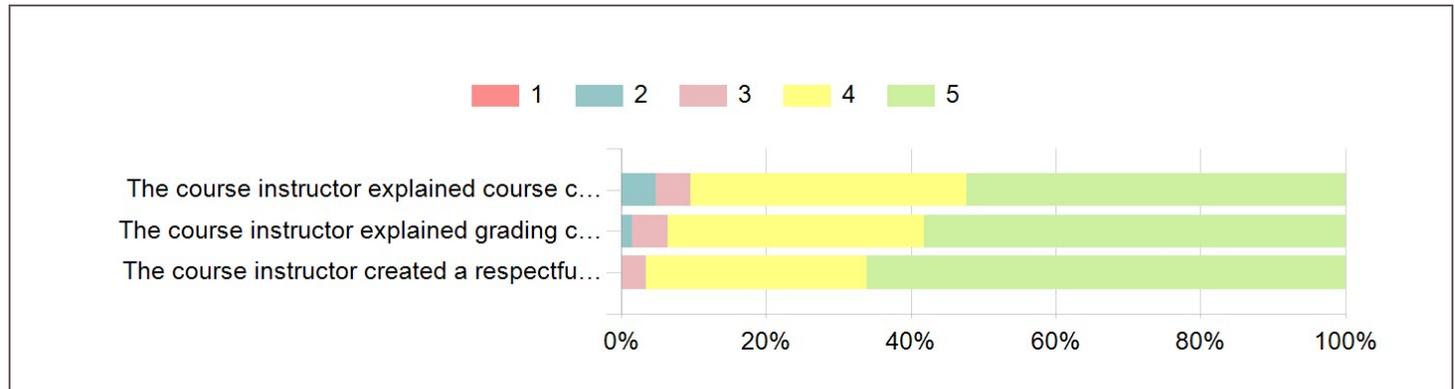

To what extent do you agree with the following statements about your experience with this course instructor:

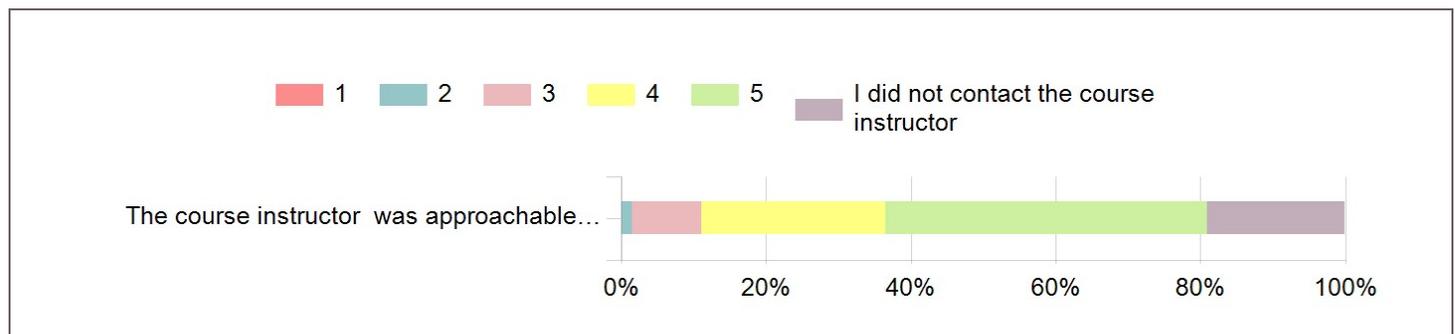

Response Distribution

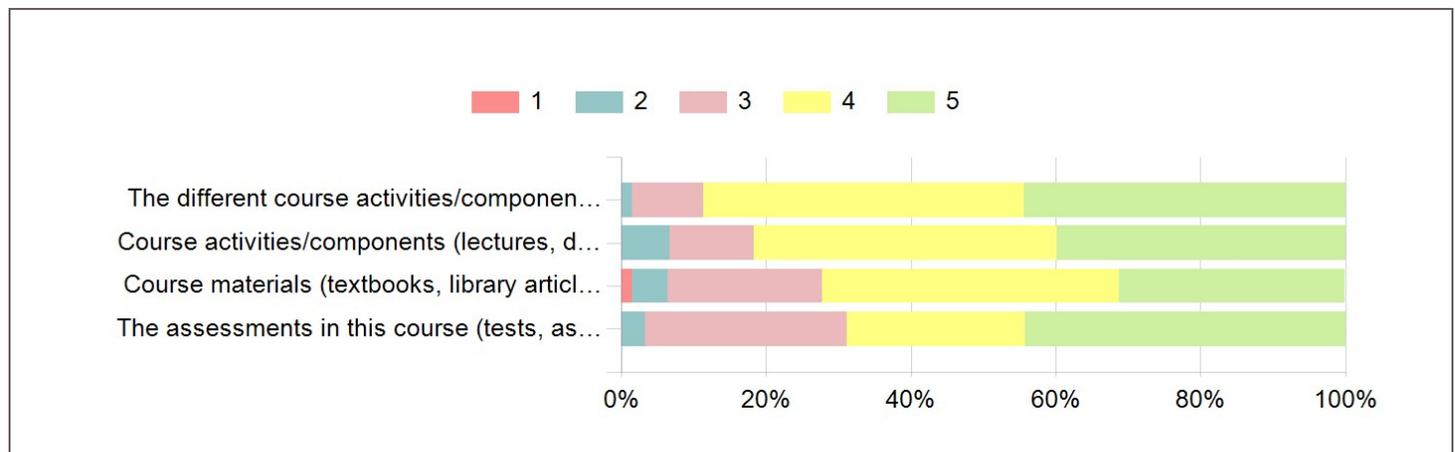

I strongly believe that Sanjay made his best effort to create a safe and open environment to which students could participate in office hours and discussions. The syllabus and course flow was exceptional and there was always help available when needed, either through Sanjay or my TA. I am happy that I was given the chance to be apart of this course and to have had the privilege of learning and developing skills from both Sanjay and my TA.
I appreciate the mixed style of synchronous and asynchronous components. I also believe the activities we do in tutorials are a very effective way to practice and test our knowledge.

Tutorials were brutal and participation was low. I often would attempt to get a conversation going based on the given assignment or discussion topic, only to be met with complete silence, making the 2 hour long tutorials feel needlessly long.
Overall I learnt a lot in the class, however I found that the tutorials weren't the best led. Ester is very friendly and approachable, but they just didn't run very smoothly and she couldn't really generate any discussion. I think if the tutorials were better I would have done better on the assignments. I believe I have a good understanding of the course content but I wasn't able to demonstrate that in the assignments. An example of the assignments would have been nice so I could understand the format required, what kind of key words to use, and how to better answer what was being asked. It wasn't very clear what Ester was looking for in the assignment based on the rubrics, because I felt like I met the requirements, but it didn't reflect in my grade. Overall some specifications and clarity on what was being looked for in the assignments would be an improvements. In the asynchronous I felt like Sanjay did a good job of explaining the concepts and provided a bunch of examples. I think what Sanjay asked for and what Ester looked for in the assignments were different. I liked the class but I think there needs to be some more clarity on what is being asked in the assignments because it was clear what I needed to do, but apparently there is some disconnect between that and what was being looked for.
I enjoyed this class a lot. Its easier to take a course when the prof is genuinely passionate about what they're teaching and not reading off their slides or a script. I've taken your POL100 class before and chose to pursue political science from it. Thank you for a great class!!

Thank you for all your work this semester, I found the assignments very helpful for understanding course concept.
Thanks for a great semester! I loved the course organization and how we were given weeks off when assignments were due, it was really helpful. The assignments were a little difficult, but I actually learned a lot from them. The only complaint I have is the lecture and tutorial formal. With online learning, it is much harder to stay focused and motivated and do the same things we did while in-person. I would recommend having multiple shorter lectures instead of one big one. In addition, the tutorials don't seem to be working. I could see how they would be beneficial in person, but the two hours was a long time online, and it sometimes seemed unnecessary. One time, I was left in a breakout room for thirty minutes and all I had to do was share with my partner. I've noticed this with other classes too, tutorials are just not as effective. Other students also don't really talk much as compared to in-person. I would suggest looking at a different way to do the tutorial next semester, or reducing it to one hour!
I was fearful of taking another research design class, however although it wasn't an easy class, Sanjay's lectures and course material really made it quite simple and easy to follow along. I really appreciated the flow of the class, everything felt like it was it was going in an orderly fashion and I was able to maintain understanding. I feel as though the course concepts are really stuck with me and I will have knowledge of them in the future as well, instead of simply for the duration of the course. I never contacted Sanjay directly, but I did attend one group office hour. It was very helpful and Sanjay was very kind as well.
Professor Jeram did a very good job explaining course concepts. All of the activities were connected and improved my understanding. Expectations were clear in regards to assignments and the midterm. Grading itself was also fair.
The worst thing by far in most courses regarding political science is grading. There does not seem to be any sort of control when it comes to grading. One TA could give you a failing grade while another gives you an A... It really seems to be whatever the TA or instructor is feeling that day. Most importantly the teacher and TA must remember that you are playing with people's livelihoods. Trying to create assignments that are challenging in reality just makes them confusing. It is hard to hit all multiple points while also freshly having learned the material.
I felt that I was not able to show my learning in a fair way. I felt like the grades to my assignments did not accurately represent my knowledge to this course. I have taken three research methods class prior to this and never have I gotten a grade this low before. I feel like I put in the effort but it was not recognized.

I thought the scheduling for lectures/quizzes/assignments worked really well, and I also appreciated having access to all the assignments/schedules at the beginning of the semester. I also really enjoyed the variety of the assigned readings and found them helpful to contextualize everything.
Professor Jeram did well to explain the key components of each section in detail and then allowed us to demonstrate our learning in challenging, but fair assignments. I enjoyed the challenge they posed as it made me reflect on the content we went over and apply it to the best of my ability.
The quality of my learning experience was fair instead of good solely because of the shift to online. Sanjay also mentioned a few times in the recorded lectures that the discussion aspect of this course was very beneficial and at a certain point he would stop and pose a question to the class. I feel that is something the tutorial could not replace. I'm not sure if tutorials could be facilitated better or if there is something else to supplement this loss of discussion. I really feel like discussion helps many students, including myself, learn better.
The online format was difficult. I feel like for this kind of class, in person or synchronous instruction would have been better. It would have been beneficial to be able to ask questions live instead of waiting for office hours or tutorials.
This class is really hard. I'm only taking it because I have to as the requirement for my degree.
I think the lectures would have been better if they were live (ie. through zoom at a set upon time with everyone present at the same time). I think it would have been better to have that kind of environment and be able to do discussion with people in lecture.
This is the second course I've taken with Sanjay and I thoroughly enjoyed it! He takes his time to explain concepts clearly, he is available pretty much all the time to help with any questions, and has responded to my emails within a couple hours every time I've reached out. The course was very engaging and I truly learned a lot, which is indicative of Sanjay's compassion and care for his students. He was flexible if we were struggling, was very helpful during office hours, and made sure to keep us updated had there been any changes to the course throughout.
